Friendship Block for Angela Davis - April 2025

Provided by Angela (Light Fabrics) -

1 – 2 ½" square (Placement 2)	$1-2 \frac{1}{2}$ x 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangle (Placement 7)
1-2 %" x 4 ¼" rectangle (Placement 3)	1-2 %" x 9 $%$ " rectangle (Placement 10)
1 – 2 ½" x 6 ¼" rectangle (Placement 6)	1 – 2 ½" x 11" rectangle (Placement 11)

You Provide -

1 – 2 /2 square (Flacement 1 – This piece should be cut to exact measurement)	
1-2 %" x 4 $%$ " rectangle (Placement 4)	1-2 %" x 9 $%$ " rectangle (Placement 9)
$1-2 \frac{1}{2}$ x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ rectangle (Placement 5)	1-2 %" x 11" rectangle (Placement 12)
1 – 2 ½" x 7 ¾" rectangle (Placement 8)	1-2 %" x 13 $%$ " rectangle (Placement 13)

The fabrics you provide should be shades of blue. Lighter in the middle working to darker outward with each strip. No Teal or Green Blues within the pattern. Must read "Blue."

You will need a glue stick, a straight ruler, a rotary cutter and an iron.

Shorten your stitch length to 1.5 for easier paper tearing. Assemble the block following the numbers. Please press but do not use steam.

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- 1. Center the Placement 1 fabric square, right side up on the wrong side of the paper. The edges will overlap the lines by at least ¼". A lightbox or window may be helpful to position it accurately. Secure the fabric to the paper with the glue stick.
- 2. Fold the paper back on the line between Placements 1 and 2.
- 3. Trim the fabric ¼" away from the fold.
- 4. Align the fabric for the next piece with the trimmed edge of the previous piece with right sides together. Unfold the paper and flip over so the paper is on top.
- 5. Stitch directly on the line, starting and ending ¼" beyond the line.
- 6. Press away from the center of the block.
- 7. Continue the same until the block is full.
